- Enroll and pass obedience class
- Take the Canine Good Citizen Test (Requirements) Find a CGC tester

- Allowing basic grooming procedures.
- Walking on a loose lead.
- Walking through a crowd.
- Sitting and lying down on command and staying in place.
- Coming when called.
- Reacting appropriately to another dog.
- Reacting appropriately to distractions.
- Calmly enduring supervised separation from the owner

Be prepared put together a resume for your dog. Make it as professional as possible and include the best, sweetest headshot you have of Fido. Costumes and Tutu's are cute and irresistible. On your dogs resume include your dog's age, personality, breed, house broken, crate trained and classes or positive hobbies, daycare. Be sure to include a section for certificates such as training classes, license, Rabies and shot records, spay or neuter certificates, and renter's liability insurance. Do not forget about references use previous landlords, veterinarians, and trainers or dog day cares.
